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“Case Acceptance Techniques” *presented by: Dr. Cameron Clifford, DDS*

“Mouth Science” *presented by: Teri Bachhofer, Delta Dental of Oklahoma Foundation*

Teri Bachhofer holds a Bachelor of Science in Education from the University of Central Oklahoma and is certified in Early Childhood and Elementary Education. Before joining the Foundation in 2016, she spent eleven years teaching first, third, and fourth grades. Teri used this skill base to help develop the Foundation's own oral health education program, MouthScience. Teri handles daily operations and manages our Captain Supertooth, MouthScience. Teri will be demonstrating how the MouthScience® Power of pH Lesson provides 3rd through 6th grade students with an engaging, hands-on experiment that demonstrates the levels of acid and sugar contained in common drinks. The purpose of the exercise is to motivate students to make intentional and healthier drink choices that will decrease their chances for cavities and gum disease. **Free MouthScience Kits will be available for attendees to take with them.*



"Maximizing Dental Treatment with CBCT: A Comprehensive Overview" *presented by: Dr. Eddie Lorents, DDS*

Cone beam computed tomography (CBCT) is a specialized type of medical imaging that produces detailed 3-dimensional (3D) images of the teeth, jaws, and surrounding structures in the head and neck. Unlike traditional dental X-rays, which only provide 2-dimensional (2D) images, CBCT allows dentists to see the teeth and surrounding structures in three dimensions, providing a more complete picture of the patient's oral health. This technology has revolutionized dentistry by enabling more accurate diagnosis and treatment planning for a wide range of dental conditions. In this presentation, we will explore the advantages of CBCT over traditional dental X-rays, common uses of CBCT in dentistry, safety considerations, and future developments in the field.



“On the Road to Oral Health Improvement Through Mobile Dentistry”

John Wilguess has wrestled with the issues of access-to-dental care and charitable dentistry as the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Dental Foundation for nearly 12 years. This challenging presentation will seek to engage you to think differently about how we help, how we fix systemic dental care problems and how we move beyond occasional charitable treatments to the creation of a new framework for getting to all of Oklahoma with a vision of sustainable oral health.
